




Student achievement and well-being are the two main focus areas every year for our work in Westside Community Schools. Academic excellence is one of the principles our district was founded on and serves as a key component of our strategic plan. We are constantly working to improve how we teach to ensure the success of our students. Just as we measure their learning with tests and exams, there are several state and national barometers that do the same for us as public school districts.


With that, we want to add a note for clarity to the test results presented to you in this report. The NSCAS assessment has been in a state of change since 2019, making these results muddy for interpretation. In addition to a new test design, there were inconsistencies in the new test that created an inability to accurately compare year-over-year scores. Furthermore, new cut scores for English Language Arts and Math will be established in the summer of 2023, which will again make annual comparisons a challenge next fall.

Because Westside prioritizes student achievement, we utilize multiple measures of academic achievement beyond NSCAS scores throughout the year to ensure we are data-informed in all of our decisions on how to best educate our children, including grade-level common assessments, FASTBridge, and NWEA MAP. Such assessments allow instructors to see students' current level of academic achievement so that teams of educators can collaborate and determine which students need extra time, extra support, or extensions. We will continue to analyze these results and work with all of our learners to ensure we are helping each child reach their full academic potential at Westside.



NATIONAL RECOGNITION FROM SPECIAL OLYMPICS

Westside Community Schools is proud to share that all 12 District 66 schools have been named National Banner Unified Champion Schools for 2022. This honor recognizes an organization's commitment to inclusion by achieving ten set standards of excellence developed by leaders in education and Special Olympics, including ongoing efforts to connect students with and without intellectual disabilities. Westside is the first district with elementary schools who have earned this honor, believed to be the first multi-school District in the state to receive this honor, and possibly the first multi-school District in the country to receive this honor.

All of Westside's 10 elementary schools, Westside Middle School and Westside High School have been awarded this distinction. Westside formally celebrated this honor by recognizing students from every school at the 2022 Homecoming Pep Rally on Friday, October 7. The entire community, as well as all students, families and staff, packed the stands at Phelps Field to celebrate this honor, and banners are now on display in all of our schools.



Who We Are... A Strategic Plan for Success

In addition to our Strategic Plan Dashboard posted online, we are working to frequently update you with evidence on how we are focusing on each of these key areas. Monthly recaps are shared in our Westside Pride newsletter.

Student Achievement and Well-Being

- Nebraska students, including at Westside, are scoring among the best in the country on national math and reading assessments according to 2022 National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) shared by the Nebraska Department of Education in October (Source, KMTV)
- Multiple career fairs, college and business tours, for both Westside High School and WHS West Campus students
- Number of credit hours, earned by Westside High School students dually enrolled with Metro Community College, doubled year to year, from 890 in 2021 to 2,046 in 2022
- Westside students scored a 3.75 out of 4.0 on the Likert scale, reflecting their level of belonging and dignity as part of our school community

Community, Collaboration, and Partnerships

- Westside leaders hosted State Senators, State Board of Education members, and Westside parents and patrons in a series of meetings this past fall to detail what we cover in our Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) curriculum, how we introduce math and reading concepts at the elementary level, and how we work on overall curriculum alignment
- We currently have 57 strategic community partners and business affiliations

Finance, Safety, and Infrastructure


- This past fall, our tax levy rate decreased for the 4th year in a row to our lowest total levy rate since 2015
- Our current 2022-23 total tax levy is 9.9 cents LOWER than it was in 2018-19
- The district has reworked its budget to allocate sustainable, annual budgetary dollars to better keep up with ongoing facility needs throughout the district
- School safety and security remains a top priority as we conduct regular audits to see how we can better enhance our buildings and campuses through more secure measures

We are excited to announce that thanks to the efforts of our amazing Board of Education, we reduced our tax levy rate for the 4th year in a row, with the second highest year-to-year levy rate drop in 25 years!


Where Does the Money Go?



For FY22, approximately 34% of all Westside students were enrolled in the district through the Option Enrollment Program. These students who chose to not enroll in their resident district in favor of coming to Westside **added \$20,123,942 in state aid revenue to our district**, allowing us to maintain 10 neighborhood elementary schools and to provide robust course offerings at Westside High School.

Revenue vs. Expenses

Since 2012/13, Westside has only had an average annual spending increase of 3.52%



- For FY22, we **reduced** our General Fund Levy by 9 pennies, the fourth year in a row it has decreased
- For FY23, the total levy (General Fund/Bond/Bldg) **decreased** by 5 pennies
- Based on a home valued at \$250,000, the annual tax payment would be \$3,213, a **decrease** of \$124.44 from the prior year

Who We Are... Building for the Future

In 2013, the District's 15-Year Facilities Master Plan was created. At that time, it identified approximately \$240 million worth of work that needed to be done throughout District 66. In 2014, Phase I of the Facilities Master Plan was approved by our voters for \$79.9 million worth of work that focused on **safety and security** and included **new buildings for Sunset Hills, Oakdale, Swanson, and Prairie Lane**. Extensive remodeling work was done at **Westside MIDDLE School** as well. All projects were done **ON TIME** and **ON BUDGET!**

Through the help of parents and community members on our Facilities Task Force, we are hoping to move into PHASE II of our facilities plan soon. Building needs at Loveland (built in 1932), Westgate (originally built in 1956 and then hastily rebuilt in 1975 after the tornado), Hillside (built in 1954), Paddock Road, Rockbrook, Westbrook, WMS, and WHS will look to be addressed when Phase II is brought forward. We are thankful that our current tax levy is 9.9 cents LOWER than it was in 2018-19. Look for much more information this spring as we look to make meaningful enhancements across the district.

Westside Human Resources



As we review the past year, our Human Resources department and our District Operations teams have remained committed to excellence and ensuring a safe, productive, and welcoming work environment that enables our approximately 1,200 staff members to do their best work every day. We re-emerged from the pandemic, finding joy in being together in person once again, but also weaving the lessons from the previous years into new ways of operating and serving the Westside community.

Within our Human Resources Department our approach to attracting, retaining, and developing the best talent has evolved since the pandemic and will continue to do so. Through a national labor shortage, we initiated several new recruitment methods, including a unique and innovative veterans recruitment and support program. Westside also continues to focus on recruiting the most highly qualified teachers and diversifying our teacher pipeline to serve the unique needs of all learners within our district community.

Our Business/Finance team rolled out new processes to improve the efficiency and efficacy of their services through the digitalization of tasks and additional support provided to both internal and external stakeholders. Led by our District Officer of Business and Finance, the team continues to work diligently to balance the fiscal needs of academic programs, facilities, technology infrastructure, human capital, student programs/services, and operations while maintaining our status as responsible stewards of public funds.

Our Nutrition Services teams and Facilities/Operations teams maneuvered around lagging supply chains and talent shortages to solidify their daily tasks of serving schools and students. With improved staffing patterns during the Fall of 2022, they remain focused on providing the essential infrastructure that fuels the daily activities in our schools, ensuring our facilities are safe and clean and our students are fed nutritious meals each day.

Our Student Services team continues to provide essential enrollment, student records, and safety services to the entire district community, focused on the highest degree of accuracy. Since most services are provided through tech-based platforms, the team strives to provide data integrity and better accessible systems (PowerSchool) for not only staff, but also for students and their families.

As our entire HR and Operations divisions press forward, we continue to let our district's Strategic Plan serve as our North Star. We will remain focused on deploying innovative solutions, while also providing support to motivate, engage and care for our dedicated team members. Our biggest asset as a district are the teams of talented adults who serve our students. It is through them that we are able to make a difference in the lives of our young people each and every day.

Who We Are... A Team United

Westside Community Schools employs a diverse roster of staff, approximately 1,200 employees, to serve our district and to pursue innovative, educational ideals and personalized learning for every student. We strive to recruit and hire top talent for all positions, from administrators and teachers to operations and nutrition services.

Who We Are... A Team United

Westside continues to enhance our framework for supporting new certified staff. This year we rolled out a survey to teachers new to Westside to better understand their experiences and needs. Teachers are provided with a 3-year support and mentoring program as they make their transition into Westside's collaborative environment. One of the unique opportunities of our opening program was to take all new teachers on a tour of Westside boundaries and option neighborhoods, with 92% of participants reporting that the tour was helpful in understanding Westside.
