

When the 2020 COVID-19 Pandemic paralyzed much of the world, Westside was among the first metro school districts to offer an organized system of instruction to support learners at home. Through Extended Campus Learning, Westside educators were able to continue teaching remotely thanks to a robust curriculum plan and 1:1 technology with internet access for every student.

As the pandemic stretched into the 20/21 school year, Westside was again among the first to offer a remote learning option, allowing families and students the choice to learn in an environment most comfortable for them. Thanks to tireless innovation, teamwork and dedication, Westside educators simultaneously taught students both in the classroom and through devices at home. Nationally recognized filmmakers, Nebraska Loves Public Schools, later featured District 66 in a special film entitled 'Standing Up To COVID.'

We Are Westside... Fully Embracing the WE

Westside Community Schools launched the **WE-SIDE Community Council** in the summer of 2020. This stands for **Welcoming Equity Support Inclusion and Dignity for Everyone**. Our goal is to ensure that all of our students and staff feel welcomed and valued at Westside.

We began by asking our community and our employees to discuss inclusion and to contemplate what Westside could do to better support students and staff of all backgrounds, races and religions. We formed a WE-SIDE steering committee to design our next steps.

We are focusing on things that bring us together by gaining a greater appreciation of our similarities and differences. Our tools

are open dialogue, data, active engagement and continuous learning and programming throughout our district.

This is not going to be a one-time issue; it is going to be fully incorporated into the fabric of Westside. Please look for more information and opportunities to get involved in 2021 as we look to expand our steering committee. We plan to have students, staff, parents, and community members join us as we analyze our curriculum, gain a better understanding of one another, address sometimes uncomfortable but critical topics, and more, with the goal of being a school district where EVERYONE belongs.

We continue to work to recruit, hire, and retain a high quality workforce that has similar demographics to our student body. WE-SIDE is just getting started!






We Are Westside... Fiscally Responsible

FY21 Budget: \$78,864,437


Where Does the Money Go?



• For FY20, approximately 35% of all Westside students were enrolled in the district through the option enrollment program. These students who chose to not enroll in their resident district in favor of coming to Westside added \$18,671,869 in state aid revenue to our district, allowing us to maintain 10 neighborhood elementary schools and to provide robust course offerings at Westside High School.

Revenue vs. Expenses

Since 2012/13, Westside has only had an average annual spending increase of 2.34%



In an effort to show our patrons we acknowledge that Nebraska's K-12 schools are over-reliant on local property taxes for revenue, we are working to become even more fiscally efficient. As a result...

- For FY21, we **reduced** our General Fund Levy for the second year in a row
- For FY21, the total levy (General Fund/Bond/Bldg) decreased by 2.5 pennies, which means...
- Based on a home valued at \$250,000, the annual tax payment would be \$3,393, a decrease of \$63.50 from the prior year

We Are Westside... Building for the Future

Our final project as part of Phase 1 in Westside's Facilities 2015 Master Plan will be completed this spring. To date, all major projects have been completed within budget.
